The Office of Educator Preparation is accepting proposals from IHEs for new programs or any revised programs of study. Proposals from public IHEs must first be submitted to the Arkansas Department of

Higher Education (<u>lillian.williams@adhe.edu</u>) for new degree or certificate programs or changes to degrees or certificates. An <u>inventory of AHECB approved degree programs</u> at all public IHEs is available on the ADHE website. <u>Updates to Federal Legislation – Teacher Preparation Program Accountability</u>

<u>The Teacher Preparation Program Rules</u> were repealed when the President signed a Congressional Review Act on March 27, 2017. These rules would have required the state to rate the effectiveness of teacher preparation programs.

Background Check Changes

Be sure to review the <u>commissioner's memo LIC-17-023</u> regarding changes to background checks. The background check consent form has been replaced with an online form. The paper form will no longer be accepted. Also, an update list of <u>Live Scan locations</u> has been posted. This should be useful information for Educator Preparation candidates.

Updates to State Legislation

The following is a list of legislation related to educator preparation that has passed this session. The new laws are effective 90 days after the final, official day of session unless a specific date is specified. Rules will be promulgated once the law is in effect. We will continue to update throughout the rules process, which may take several months to complete. Some of the new legislation that directly affects educator preparation include the following:

<u>Act 294</u> has several revisions to educator licensure and educator preparation programs. The revisions allow for the ADE to create a tiered licensure system that promotes the education profession while providing flexibility for schools to hire quality teacher and school leader candidates and strengthen the educator

workforce. Other revisions include the renaming of "nontraditional programs" to "alternative educator licensure programs" and streamlining their requirements.

Act 295 has several revisions to TESS. TESS has been substantially changed for greater school and district flexibility while maintaining the essential framework for professional support, growth, and evaluations. Act 295 accounts for ESSA flexibility and enhanced accountability to ensure that all students have access to effective teachers. As this Act becomes effective, many of the prescriptive requirements for TESS will change; however, the feedback and support components remain firmly in place.

Act 416 requires candidates applying for an elementary education (K-6) license or a special education (K-12) license to pass a stand-alone reading test.

Act 564 amends several provisions in the Professional Licensure Standards Board (PLSB) legislation. Fingerprints will be allowed to be taken by any method approved by the Arkansas State Police. The amendments also will allow for the opportunity for the state to participate in the state and federal rap back programs. The audits of Educator Preparation Programs will no longer be conducted every seven years. Instead the PLSB will establish an annual review of EPP quality based on an approved set of criteria.
