FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER
IN RE CHARLES JACKSON HANSON, PLSB CASE NO. 14-179

At its regular meeting on February 12, 2015, the Arkansas State Board of Education (Board) accepted the recommendation of the Professional Licensure Standards Board Ethics Subcommittee for disciplinary action against the teaching license of Charles Jackson Hanson. Based upon Mr. Hanson's failure to respond to the subcommittee's recommendation and the evidence presented, in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act, Ark. Code Ann. 25-15-101 et seq., the Board hereby states as follows:

I. Findings of Fact:

- a. The Arkansas Department of Education issued Charles Jackson Hanson a lifetime teaching license on January 1, 2013.
- b. The Professional Licensure Standards Board Ethics Subcommittee received an allegation that Mr. Hanson violated the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators promulgated pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § § 6-17-422 and 6-17-428.
- c. The subcommittee authorized an investigation into allegations that Mr. Hanson violated Standard 2: An educator maintains competence regarding skills, knowledge, and dispositions relating to his/her organizational position, subject matter, and/or pedagogical practice.
- d. Mr. Hanson was notified on June 17, 2014, of the subcommittee's authorization on June 6, 2014, to investigate this allegation.

- e. After considering the investigator's report and evidence on November 5, 2014, the subcommittee unanimously found that reasonable belief existed to substantiate a violation of Standard 2 in that Charles Jackson Hanson:

Took Part II of the TESS evaluation test with the assistance of a high school English teacher.

- f. The subcommittee recommended that the State Board place Mr. Hanson's license on probation for one (1) year and assess a fine of \$75.
- g. Mr. Hanson was notified of the subcommittee's reasonable belief determination and recommendation on November 6, 2014, by certified and regular mail. Mr. Hanson did not respond to the recommendation and he did not request a hearing thereby waiving his right to any further notice or hearing or any other rights he might have under the Administrative Procedure Act including those rights set forth in Ark. Code Ann. §§ 25-15-211 and 25-15-212.
- h. At today's meeting, the subcommittee's recommendation and supporting documentation were presented to the Board as part of its consent agenda.

II. Conclusions of Law:

- a. Upon consideration of the evidence presented at the meeting and pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-11-105, 6-17-401, 6-17-422, 6-17-428 and 25-15-201 et seq., and the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators, the Board adopts the recommendations of the subcommittee.
- b. Accordingly, the Board orders that Charles Jackson Hanson's license be placed on probation for one (1) year and assesses a fine of \$75.

- c. Mr. Hanson is cautioned that further violations of the Code of Ethics or failure to pay the fine within thirty (30) days from the date of this order may result in more severe discipline including permanent revocation of his license.
- d. This order shall remain permanently in Mr. Hanson's professional licensure file and the confidential files of the Professional Licensure Standards Board.
