Re: Letter of Intent to Apply for an Open-Enrollment Public Charter School


To Whom It May Concern:

It is the intention of Responsive Education Solutions (“ResponsiveEd”) to submit an application for an open-enrollment public charter school in Little Rock, Arkansas, to be located within the boundaries of either the Little Rock School District or Pulaski County Special School District, and to be referred to as Quest Middle School of Little Rock. ResponsiveEd operates over 60 open-enrollment public charter schools in Arkansas and Texas, with an enrollment of over 14,000 students in 2012-13. The mission of ResponsiveEd is to provide hope for students through an innovative, encouraging, character-based, individualized learning environment where they are academically successful and develop into lifelong learners. ResponsiveEd has been authorized by the Arkansas Secretary of State to transact business in the State of Arkansas as a Non-Profit Corporation and has received recognition of exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The proposed campus anticipates serving grades 5-8 with a maximum enrollment of 220 students in its first year of operation. Quest Middle School of Little Rock intends to add one or more grades a year for a maximum enrollment in 5-12 of 460 students. This goal will be achieved at Quest Middle School of Little Rock through the use of a college-prep curriculum that will ensure students have a solid foundation of content learning. This school will teach character education and leadership at all levels; equipping students with the tools necessary for success in later years.
