

English Language Learners (ELL) funding is the Arkansas categorical funding program that supports students who are not proficient in English. These students face the challenge of learning a new language in addition to the challenge of mastering academic subject matter being taught in that language. In FY2012-13 there were 34,272 ELL students in the state's school districts. Data retrieved from ADE's State Aid Notice reports indicate the growth in ELL enrollment has increased by 95 percent since 2005. The chart below reflects the growth of ELL students as well as the growth in the proportion of all students who are ELL.

History and Purpose: Families whose native language is not English have been arriving in Arkansas seeking employment opportunities in agriculture-related and other industries. School-age children from these families are relatively new to most of our school districts, and the educational programs necessary to meet their needs in many school districts are also relatively new. Over the last eight years the population of language-minority children (LMS) enrolled in Arkansas public schools has increased over 51%.

A yearly survey (the Home Language Survey) of all school districts is conducted to determine the number, distribution, grade-level, specific language background and degree of English proficiency of language-minority students. The 2013-2014 school year enrollment of language minority students (LMS) is 46,351, distributed among 171 school districts. Of this number, over 35,497 are not proficient in English. ADE has identified 95 home languages other than English spoken in homes with school-age children; 86% speak Spanish, 5.5% speak Marshallese, and 1.36% speak Vietnamese.

Limited English Proficient (LEP) students are provided instructional support to attain proficiency in English and to make adequate academic progress in all core content subjects while they are learning English. Provision of these services is mandated by Federal Civil rights Title VI protections afforded National Origin/language minority students, by Federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) legislation, and by state (school accreditation standards) requirements.

Funding: \$311.00 per LEP student enrolled is being provided thru state funding to school districts, and \$3 mil. in Federal Title III funds will be awarded to LEAs.

Terms and Definitions

LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENT (LEP)

(Title IX Part A Section 9101 Definitions (25))(A-D)

The term “limited English proficient”, when used with respect to an individual, means an individual:

- (A) who is aged 3 through 21
- (B) who is enrolled or preparing to enroll in an elementary school or secondary school
- (C)(i) who was not born in the United States or whose native language is a language other than English
- (ii)(I) who is a Native American or Alaska Native, or a native resident of the outlying areas

- **(II) who comes from an environment where a language other than English has had a significant impact on the individual's level of English language proficiency**
- **(iii) who is migratory, whose native language is a language other than English, and who comes from an environment where a language other than English is dominant**
- **(D) whose difficulties in speaking, reading, writing, or understanding the English language may be sufficient to deny the individual**
- **(i) the ability to meet the State's proficient level of achievement on State assessments described in section 1111(b)(3);** • **(ii) the ability to successfully achieve in classrooms where the language of instruction is English**

LANGUAGE MINORITY STUDENT (LMS)


A person or language community that is not from the dominant language group. In the U.S., a language-minority child may be bilingual, limited-English proficient, or English monolingual (Lesso-Hurley, 1991).

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL)

English as a second language (ESL) is an educational approach in which English language learners are instructed in the use of the English language. Their instruction is based on a special curriculum that typically involves little or no use of the native language, focuses on language (as opposed to content) and is usually taught during specific school periods. For the rest of the school day, students may be placed in mainstream classrooms, an immersion program, or a bilingual education program. Every bilingual education program has an ESL component (U.S. General Accounting Office, 1994).

ELL STUDENT POPULATION DENSITY FOR EACH DISTRICT

Fifty-six percent (19,211) of the 34,272 ELL students in the state during SY2012-13 were served by four school districts—Springdale (8,636), Rogers (4,837), Fort Smith (3,455), and Little Rock (2,283).

School District Boundaries from the Arkansas Geographical Informational Office






ANNUAL LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENT STUDENT TOTALS








Language Minority Student (LMS) Enrollment Totals Grades K-12 2013-2014


Limited English Proficient (LEP) Student Enrollment

Totals Grades K-12 2013-2014





TEN LARGEST LEP HOME LANGUAGE GROUPS 2013-2014




**SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH

OF LMS STUDENTS**





2013 NAEP Surrounding States




**SCHOOL DISTRICTS WITH
