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Rogers Named Assistant Commissioner for Fiscal and Administrative Services

LITTLE ROCK — Arkansas Department of Education Commissioner Johnny Key is pleased to announce Greg Rogers as the assistant commissioner for Fiscal and Administrative Services.

Rogers, who currently serves as the chief fiscal officer, will begin transitioning to his new role July 1. He replaces Dr. Eric Saunders, who was named the new assistant commissioner for Research and Technology.

“During Mr. Rogers’ 18 years in state government, he has built strong relationships with numerous agencies and legislators,” Key said. “In addition, his background includes more than 10 years of experience with education funding matters, making him a great selection for the assistant commissioner position.”

As the assistant commissioner, Rogers will oversee the distribution of funds to public schools, as well as the daily operations of the Child Nutrition Unit, school finance and student management software, and fiscal distress unit. He also will continue to serve as the agency’s chief fiscal officer.

Rogers joined ADE in 2012. As the chief fiscal officer, he oversees the agency’s financial operations, including biennial and fiscal year budget requests, and represents the agency at legislative committee meetings.

His state government experience began in 1997 when he worked as an individual income tax auditor for the Arkansas Department of Finance and Administration. In 1998, he was promoted to a revenue division manager, a position he held until 2001 when he was promoted to a senior budget analyst. In this role, Rogers provided technical assistance and oversaw agencies’ fiscal expenditures. He also assisted agencies with preparing biennial budgets.

In 2004, he served as the budget manager for the Arkansas Department of Human Services before returning to DF&A as a senior budget analyst later that year. From 2004 to 2011, Rogers provided

budget assistance to various agencies including ADE before being named the assistant administrator for the Office of Administrative Services.

Rogers received a Bachelor of Business Administration in Accounting from Southern Arkansas University at Magnolia and a Master of Business Administration in International Business from Salem International University in Salem, W.V.

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
